The film "Broken Rainbow" is an Academy Award winning documentary on the struggle of the Dineh (Navajo) people at Black Mesa, Arizona, who have been callously cast aside to make room for the environmentally devastating practice of mining coal, oil, uranium, and natural gas. The Dineh and their supporters have been battling with Peabody Coal, the BIA, and state/local governments for over 30 years to stop a forced relocation from their homeland and the continuation/ expansion of mining operations.
