#### First Call Information:

On Sunday, May 06, 2012, about 0129 hours, I (UNUBUN) received a call from Oakland Police Department (OPD) Officer J. BUNA #8646. BUNA was reporting an officer involved shooting that occurred at 9230 Birch Street, Oakland. BUNA told me the decedent, an unidentified African American male, had been shot by an OPD Officer, after the decedent brandished a firearm during a foot pursuit and shot at the officer. BUNA told me the decedent was determined, on scene, by Dr. BAILEY at 0020 hours and was transported to Highland Hospital because the scene was unsafe.

Officer BUNA did not have any more details about the incident.

About 0140 hours, I called OPD dispatch and I was informed they received an "officer needs help" call at 0003 hours at the above mentioned location. OPD dispatch did not have any more details about the incident. (SU#1914)

#### Medical Summary:

The decedent sustained multiple gunshot wounds to his chest and torso. (SU#1914)

#### Description of the Death/Injury Scene:

The decedent was determined dead in front of 9230 Birch Street, Oakland. (SU#1914)

#### **Body Identification:**

The decedent is unidentified at this time.

On Sunday, May 6, 2012, about 0645 hours, Officer P. TRAN of the Oakland Police Department Major Crimes Unit called and provided a tentative identification for the decedent as WILLIAMS, Laron with PFN: (person file number) BGP281. I (FRAZIER) searched the CRIMS system and I printed the information and a booking photo. Officer TRAN came to the Coroner's Bureau and Investigator WILSON compared the photo to the decedent's face and it appears to be the same person. (CEF1691)

On Sunday, May 6, 2012, about 0925 hours, Officer TRAN called the Coroner's Bureau and told Deputy GOGNA that Laron WILLIAMS was alive and in custody in the state prison system. (CEF1691)

On Sunday, May 6, 2012, around 1000 hours, I (WILSON) received a call from Officer J. ANDERSON of the Oakland Police Department Major Crimes Unit who told me the parents of Alan BLUEFORD went to the Oakland Police Department because they were told by their son's friends that their son, Alan, was killed this morning. Officer ANDERSON gave me BLUEFORD's date of birth and Juvenile File Number (JFN: 01J023836). I obtained the arrest photo and attempted to use it to confirm the decedent's





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identity. There seemed to be a slight resemblance between the decedent and the photo, but I could not positively confirm the identification. (dlw29)

At 1530 hours, I obtained a phone number for the decedent's mother, Geralyn BLUEFORD, and called her. I spoke to her and the decedent's father, Adam BLUEFORD, on speaker phone and offered to allow them to view an identification photo of the decedent to confirm his identity. They declined the offer and stated it was too stressful. Geralyn and Adam elected to wait for the Coroner's Bureau to confirm identification via fingerprint comparison. (dlw29)

On Monday, May 7, 2012, about 1710 hours, I (ENGEL) received a faxed confirmation the decedent was positively identified as Alan Dwayne BLUEFORD based upon a fingerprint comparison. I contacted OPD Sgt. FLEMING and left a message notifying him of the results. I placed the fax into the case file for future reference. (TPE1611)

#### Next of Kin Investigation:

The decedent was never married and he had no children, therefore, his legal next of kin are his parents Adam and Geralyn BLUEFORD. (SU#1914)

#### Other Agency Reports:

Oakland Police Department report # 12-021875. Sergeant S. FLEMING was the homicide detective assigned to the case. (SU#1914)

#### Property and Evidence:

The decedent and all the property on his person was processed into the morgue as evidence. (SU#1914)

#### Coroners Fees:

Coroner's Fees do apply to the decedent's case. The decedent was reportedly an active participant in a crime, and therefore is not considered an innocent victim. As of 5/6/12, there are \$321.00 in Coroner's Fees; \$254.00 of which is for the removal of the decedent, and \$67.00 for the preparation of the decedent. (SU#1914)

On Monday, May 7, 2012, about 1726 hours, I (ENGEL) contacted the decedent's father, Adam BLUEFORD, and notified him of the positive identification of his son, Alan BLUEFORD. I explained the Coroner's involvement and the need to begin mortuary selection. Adam asked if I could give him specific details concerning the death of his son. I explained the investigation was active and he would have to contact OPD for details. Adam stated he understood. (TPE1611)

#### Other Investigative Details/Supplemental Information:

On Sunday, May 06, 2012, about 0200 hours, Deputy WILLIAMS and I (UNUBUN) arrived at ACMC-Highland Campus to complete the removal. I was met by Officer BUNA, who was standing in front of ER 4 where the decedent was located. BUNA told me the decedent was determined at the scene and was transported to the hospital by Paramedics Plus, due to scene safety. BUNA was unable to tell me who authorized the removal of the decedent from the scene.

I pulled the curtains to ER-4 and I saw the decedent lying supine on a hospital bed and covered with a trauma blanket. I removed the blanket and noticed the decedent was wearing pants and shoes. There

were three deep circular shaped wounds on his chest and torso. There was no additional visible trauma. The decedent's hands were placed into brown paper bags and secured with zip ties to preserve evidence. We took photographs of the body, placed the body on the gurney, and moved the body to the Coroner's van without incident. I issued Coroner's Bureau receipt #32379 for the body and property removed from the scene and we departed.

We went to the scene of the incident on the 9200 block of Birch Street. Upon arrival, we were met by Sergeant Sean FLEMING who told us the following.

OPD officers were conducting a "walk and stop" on 90th Avenue and they contacted three individuals that matched the description of suspects in a crime that occurred earlier in the day. When the individuals were contacted, the decedent fled on foot northbound on 90th Avenue. A foot pursuit ensued and the decedent fled eastbound on Olive Street, southbound on 92<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and finally eastbound on Birch Street. He slowed down in front of 9230 Birch Street and walked inside the driveway of the fenced residence. He pulled out a handgun and started shooting at the officer. The officer returned fire with his department issued weapon, striking the decedent three times in the chest and torso. It is still undetermined how many shots were fired by the decedent, but one of the shots struck the officer in the right foot. The officer was transported to ACMC-Highland Campus and the decedent was determined dead, at the scene, about 0020 hours. The decedent was also transported to ACMC-Highland Campus due to scene safety per authorization of OPD Lieutenant MEEKS. We took scene photos and departed.

Upon my return to the Coroner's Bureau, intake photos were taken and the decedent was processed into the morgue with a yellow tag as the case was considered a homicide. (SU#1914)

On Saturday, July 07, 2012, I (UNUBUN) faxed a request to OPD Major Crimes Unit for permission to release the press hold regarding this case. The fax was placed in the case file.

This case was sent to Awaiting Supervisor Review with an active press hold on the case. (SU#1914)

#### Findings:

On Saturday, July 07, 2012, I (UNUBUN) reviewed this case for the purpose of establishing a manner of death. Based on my review, the manner of death has been established as a homicide. A review of the police investigation, Autopsy Protocol, and the physical evidence are consistent with this finding in that they all indicate the decedent sustained multiple gunshot wounds, which caused death.

#### Supervisor Review:

On 07/18/12, I (Sgt. D. HARRIS) reviewed this case. I concur with the findings and approve this case for closure. (DH1113)

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- 2 The body is that of an African American male appearing the
- 3 stated age of 18 years. There is a Coroner's identification tag
- 4 present on the shoe on the left foot. The body is 67 inches
- 5 long and weighs 174 pounds.
- 6 BODY MEASUREMENTS:
- 7 The distance from the sternal notch to the base of each
- **8** foot is 54 inches.
- 9 The distance from the spinous process of the seventh
- 10 cervical vertebral body to the base of each foot is 55 inches.

109 The chest is flat. Breasts are consistent with an adult 110 male. The abdomen is flat. The external genitalia are normal. 111 Legs and feet are without further abnormalities. 112 The fingernails have been clipped prior to autopsy. Over 113 the dorsal aspect of the left wrist is a very vague area, horizontally oriented, linear, about 2 inches x 1/8 inch. The 114 115 possibility of this representing a binding indentation site 116 cannot be excluded. Otherwise, binding indentation sites are 117 not grossly identified. No smoke, powder or stippling is identified on either arm or hand. No needle puncture marks are 118 119 present. No hyperpigmented scars are present over accessible 120 veins. No further blunt injuries are noted to arms or hands. 121 Present on the right side of the back is a group of open 122 defects on the skin consistent with secondary missile defects. 123 These are located in the center, 19 inches below and 5-3/4inches to the side of C7. These are all characterized by areas 124 125 of abrading or small breaks in the skin. No foreign material or metal are identified with these. In the superior aspect of this 126 group are approximately six to seven areas of secondary missile 127 defects. Present in the inferior aspect of this group are four 128 to five secondary missile defects. The largest within the total 129 130 group ranges upwards to 3/4 inch in greatest dimension.

131 back is without further abnormalities. 132 INTERNAL EXAMINATION The body is opened through the usual Y-SHAPED INCISION. 133 Except for gunshot wounds no abnormalities are noted. 134 135 GUNSHOT WOUND SUMMARY 136 GUNSHOT WOUND #2 TYPE: Entrance gunshot wound. 137 LOCATION: Frontside of the left shoulder, soft tissue. 138 DIRECTION: The basic direction is towards the back of 139 140 the body, up towards the top of the head at a 10-degree angle and towards the left side of the body at a 10-degree angle. 141 142 AREAS INVOLVED: Soft tissue of the left shoulder. 143 EXIT: Exit wound #1 144 BULLET: None. 145 This is a hemorrhagic gunshot wound. 146 No smoke is noted along the path of the entrance wound. 147 DESCRIPTION: This is a through-and-through gunshot wound involving the soft tissue of the left shoulder. 148 GUNSHOT WOUND #3 149

TYPE: Entrance gunshot wound,

LOCATION: Frontside of the left chest.

152 The basic direction is towards the back of DIRECTION: 153 the body, up towards the top of the head at a 20-degree angle 154 and towards the left side of the body at a 20-degree angle. 155 AREAS INVOLVED: Soft tissue torso, pericardial sac. 156 ribs, heart, left pleural cavity and left lung. 157 EXIT: None. 158 BULLET: A deformed, moderate-sized, brass-colored bullet 159 is recovered in the soft tissue of the left back. 160 This is a hemorrhagic gunshot wound. 161 No smoke is noted along the path of the entrance wound. 162 DESCRIPTION: This gunshot wound enters in the left 163 front chest. It passes through the left fifth rib. 164 penetrates into the pericardial sac, passes through the heart entering on the front and exiting on the back of the heart. 165 166 involves heart muscle, right ventricle, septum and left 167 ventricle. From here it penetrates into the left pleural 168 cavity, passes through the left lung entering on the front 169 surface and exiting on the posterolateral surface and coming 170 about 1-1/2 inches of the hilar area. From here it exits the back outside of the left pleural cavity passing through the left 171

sixth rib. The bullet is recovered just beyond this point.

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- 173 OTHER: In association with this gunshot wound is a
- 174 1000-cc left hemothorax and 100 cc hemopericardium.
- 175 GUNSHOT WOUND #4
- 176 TYPE: Entrance gunshot wound.
- 177 LOCATION: Right frontside of the torso.
- 178 DIRECTION: The basic direction is towards the back of
- 179 the body, down towards the feet at a 10-degree angle and towards
- 180 the left side of the body at a 25-degree angle.
- 181 AREAS INVOLVED: Soft tissue of the torso, right eighth
- 182 rib, peritoneal cavity, liver, gallbladder and L1 vertebral
- 183 body.
- 184 EXIT: None.
- BULLET: A moderate-sized, deformed, brass-colored bullet
- 186 is recovered in the spinal canal of the area of L1.
- 187 This is a hemorrhagic gunshot wound.
- No smoke is noted along the path of the entrance wound.
- 189 DESCRIPTION: This gunshot wound enters in the right
- 190 frontside of the torso. It passes through right eighth rib
- 191 penetrating into the peritoneal cavity. It passes through the
- 192 liver entering on the anterior surface exiting on the inferior
- 193 surface and just causing a grazing defect to the gallbladder.
- 194 From here it penetrates into the retroperitoneum. It does not

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- 195 penetrate the pancreas. It then penetrates the L1 vertebral
- 196 body. It comes to rest in the spinal canal.
- 197 OTHER: In association with this gunshot wound is a 400
- 198 cc hemoperitoneum. Also, the spinal canal is opened. The
- 199 spinal cord appears to be intact but the bullet does lie in very
- 200 close proximity to it.
- 201 BODY CAVITIES: Other than gunshot wounds no abnormalities.
- 202 The pleural cavities, pericardial cavity and peritoneal cavity
- 203 are lined by smooth, glistening surfaces and contain no fluid.
- 204 Ribs and diaphragms are intact.
- 205 HEART: In situ, the heart is normal, with the apex at the
- 206 left midclavicular line. The heart weighs 300 grams. The
- 207 epicardial surface is smooth and glistening. Ventricular
- 208 myocardium is brown. Chambers are normal. Valves are normal.
- 209 No left ventricular hypertrophy is present. No asymmetric
- 210 hypertrophy is present. No myxoid degeneration of the mitral
- 211 valve is present. No vegetations are present on valve leaflets.
- 212 Coronary ostia are patent. The coronary system has its usual
- 213 anatomical distribution and is nonremarkable. No thrombi are
- 214 present. Other than the gunshot wound no abnormalities.
- VESSELS: The aorta and tributaries are nonremarkable. The
- 216 pulmonary artery and venous system contain no thromboemboli.

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- 217 TRACHEA AND BRONCHI: Lined by pale yellow mucosal
- 218 surfaces.
- 219 LUNGS: The left lung weighs 160 grams. The right lung
- 220 weighs 270 grams. Pleural surfaces are smooth. Lung parenchyma
- is mildly congested and edematous. Some intraparenchymal 221
- 222 aspiration of blood is present.
- ORAL CAVITY: Yellow-metal-colored teeth caps are present 223
- on the anterior teeth, both the mandible and the maxilla. The 224
- 225 tongue is normal.
- 226 ESOPHAGUS: Lined by a white, wrinkled mucosal surface.
- STOMACH: Contains scant amounts of soft brown food 227
- 228 material. The mucosal surface is tan. No tumors or ulcers are
- 229 noted.
- 230 INTESTINES: Covered by smooth serosal surfaces. No
- 231 abnormalities are noted.
- 232 LIVER: Weighs 1800 grams. The serosal surface is smooth
- and glistening. The anterior margin is sharp. The parenchyma 233
- 234 is pale. Other than the gunshot wound no abnormalities.
- 235 tumors are present. No fatty metamorphosis or cirrhosis is
- 236 present.
- 237 GALLBLADDER: The gallbladder is of normal size. Its
- surface is smooth. Its wall is of normal thickness. It is 238

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- 239 lined by a green velvety mucosal surface. It contains no bile
- 240 and no stones.
- PANCREAS: The pancreas is of normal size. Its parenchyma
- 242 is yellow-brown and lobulated. No tumors are present. No
- 243 saponification is noted.
- SPLEEN: The spleen weighs 100 grams. Its capsule is gray
- 245 and smooth. Its parenchyma is red-purple and soft.
- 246 ADRENAL GLANDS: The adrenals are normal in size and have
- 247 their usual triangular shape. Sectioning of them reveals non-
- 248 remarkable cortex and medullary parts. No hemorrhages are
- 249 present.
- 250 KIDNEYS: The kidneys weigh 110 grams each. Surfaces are

- 252 medullary separation. Papillae are normal. The calyces and
- 253 pelves of both kidneys are nonremarkable. No obvious
- 254 abnormalities are noted of the ureters. No stones are present.
- 255 BLADDER: The bladder contains 120 cc of urine. It is
- 256 lined by a tan mucosal surface. No trabeculation or tumors are
- 257 present. No diverticula are noted.
- 258 PROSTATE: The prostate is of normal size. Its parenchyma
- 259 is yellow-white and rubbery. No tumors are noted.

260 TESTICLES: Both testicles are examined and no trauma or 261 abnormalities are identified. 262 MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: Soft tissue of the rectus 263 abdominous muscle and the psoas muscles are incised into and no 264 abnormalities are identified. The pleural surfaces are 265 stripped. Soft tissue is taken down from around the torso. 266 Individual ribs are dissected around. No further abnormalities 267 are noted. 268 NECK: Individual laryngeal structures are taken down. 269 hyoid bone is introgenically disrupted during the autopsy. 270 autopsy artifact does not represent, no soft tissue hemorrhages 271 are noted. The larynx is free of obstructing material. The cervical vertebral column and thyroid gland is normal. 272 273 CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: Soft tissue about the cranial vault is normal. The brain weighs 1340 grams. The gyri and 274 275 sulci of the cerebral hemispheres are normal. Sectioning of the 276 brain reveals no abnormalities. No contusions are noted. 277 ventricular system of the brain is nonremarkable. No subdural 278 or subarachnoid hemorrhages are present. The vessels at the 279 base of the brain are nonremarkable. Stripping the dura from

the inner table of the skull reveals no abnormalities.
