"Black San Francisco: Our Roots, Our Struggle, Our Strength" with Prof. Aliyah Dunn-Salahuddin

Ms. Dunn-Salahuddin is an assistant professor of History and African-American experience at City College, with a focus on the African-American experience in the Bay Area, with emphasis on the Bay View-Hunters Point. With her research work she hopes to bring light to the continued systemic and institutionalized oppression of Black communities outside of the American South.

"Remembering the Port Chicago Disaster" with Stephanie Meckler, Park Ranger, National Park Service, U.S. Dept of the Interior

Ranger Meckler of the Port Chicago Naval Magazine Memorial will describe the disaster of July 17, 1944 which claimed the lives of mainly African American sailors, and exposed the ugly truth about racism in the U.S. military during World War II. A subsequent mutiny trial and convictions of 50 African American sailors set the stage for the modern Civil Rights Movement. This history will help us understand the ongoing demands for equal justice of the Black Lives Matter movement.
