To whom it may concern:

I graduated from the University of California at Davis School of Veterinary Medicine in 1998. 20 years ago, I began my veterinary career at a small animal practice called Arroyo Animal Clinic in Sunnyvale, CA. From 2000 until 2004 I served on the Board of Directors of Humane Society Silicon Valley, and Chaired the Ethics Committee for that same organization. Several years ago, I decided to focus my practice on farmed animals, especially chickens. For the past 4 years I have been the full-time veterinarian at a nonprofit farmed animal sanctuary, which has rescued more than 600 chickens from neglect and abuse situations since 2014.

I have been asked by attorney Wayne Hsiung to review the document entitled *DxE Biosecurity Protocols*, with the goal of evaluating the effectiveness of prescribed biosecurity protocols for independent investigators.

I am impressed with the thoroughness of the aforementioned document, and the protocols described therein. Assuming these protocols are followed, the risk to animal and human health will be minimal, and certainly no greater than the risk posed by humans working at such facilities during regular, daily operations.
